Did you ever wonder how many NFL teams have compiled successful season winning percentages despite the number of interceptions thrown by their quarterbacks far outnumbering the number of touchdown passes thrown by them. I decided a fair cutoff point would be teams that won at least 60 percent of their games whose quarterbacks threw at least 10 more interceptions than touchdown passes. It's happened eight times in the NFL since 1960. Here they are:

I decided a fair cutoff point would be teams that won 40 percent or less of their games whose quarterbacks threw at least 10 more touchdown passes than interceptions. It's happened five times in the NFL since 1960. Here they are:

I decided a fair cutoff point would be teams that won at least 60 percent of their games. Including the 1920 and '21 seasons when the NFL was called the APFA, fourteen times in NFL history a team has won at least 60 percent of its games yet yielded more points than it scored. Here they are:

I decided a fair cutoff point would be teams that won 40 percent or less of their games. Including the 1920 and '21 seasons when the NFL was called the APFA, 17 times in NFL history a team has won 40 percent or less of its games yet scored more points than it yielded. Here they are:
